Pairing and programming the remote control

Introduction

Before fully utilizing your new remote control with your TV, it's essential to pair and program it to recognize key functions. This process ensures seamless integration and functionality. Below are detailed steps for programming the essential buttons: Power, Mute, Volume Up, and Volume Down.

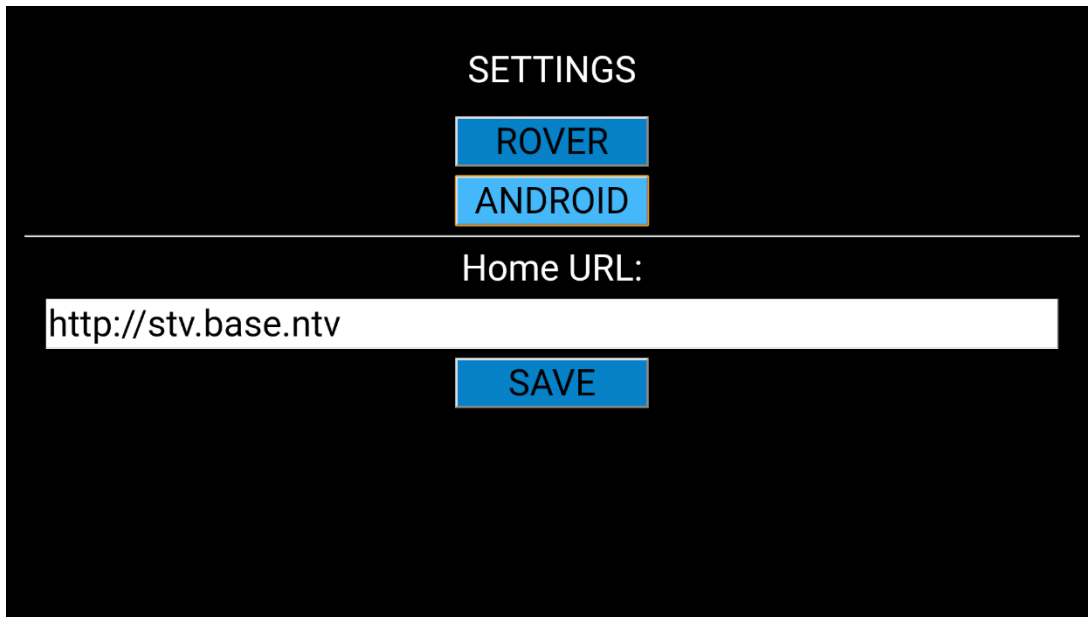
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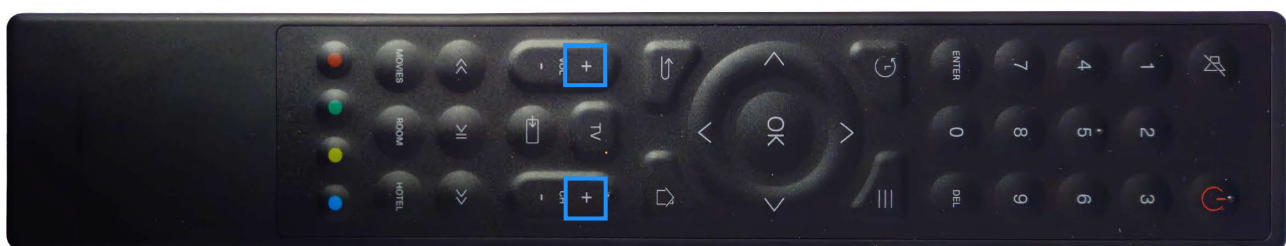
1 Pairing the remote with a TV

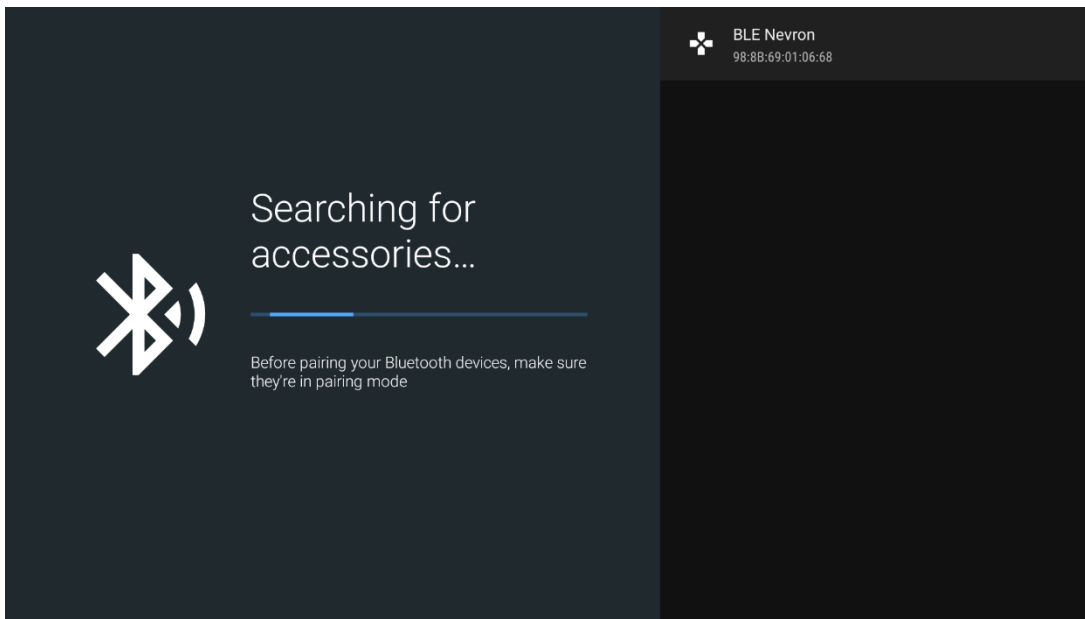
To make the remote work on your TV, it needs to be paired with the connected STB (Set top box).

To enter pairing mode, point the remote into the STB and press 1590. A menu will open. Press the 2nd button "ANDROID". From there navigate to the devices menu and select "Add device".



A searching screen will open. Set your remote into pairing mode by pressing the CH + and Volume + buttons at the same time until the light starts flashing. The remote should appear on the TV screen.





From there click OK and wait for a success message "Paired".

Your remote is now paired to the STB. To test it, turn the remote away from the box and try pressing the buttons. All the buttons including volume and mute should work using a Bluetooth connection.

The on and off button should work using CEC and will turn the TV (not the Set Top Box) on and off. If everything works, the process is complete. In case it doesn't, please follow the next steps:

2 Programming the remote control

4 buttons need to be programmed in total: Power, Mute, Volume up, and Volume down. For each button you will need to follow and repeat the following steps:

1. Place the new remote and the original TV remote facing each other, approximately 1-3cm apart.



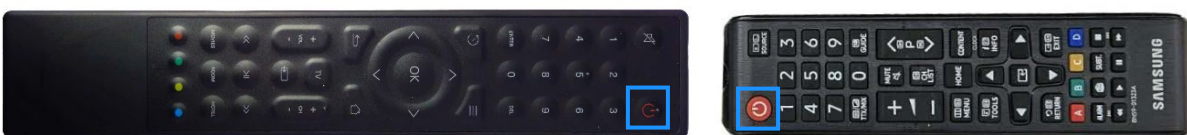
2. Long press (3s) the power button on the new remote to activate learning mode. The red light indicator should illuminate and remain steady.



3. Click the button you wish to program. The red light should start flashing slowly.



4. Press the corresponding button on the original TV remote. The red light on the new remote will flash quickly three times upon successful signal reception.



5. Press any non-programmable button (such as number keys, OK, back) to save the learned key.

MAKE SURE THE REMOTE IS PAIRED WITH A STB BEFORE THE NEXT STEP.

3 Enabling hybrid mode

1. Make sure all 4 buttons are ready and the Remote control is paired with a TV before the next steps: Hold down the Mute and Ch- buttons simultaneously to enable hybrid mode on the remote control. The light will flash quickly 5 times to confirm the mode.



2. Verify the functionality of all programmed buttons. The programmed buttons should exclusively operate using IR, not Bluetooth. Test this by hiding the remote under a table and pressing a programmed button—it should not respond. Conversely, non-programmed keys (OK, back, numbers) should function using Bluetooth from anywhere in the room.

4 Resetting the remote control

To reset the remote, hold down the ok and home buttons for 3 seconds. The light will flash 3 times. This means the remote is now reset and doesn't have any of the buttons programmed.
